The Mechernich church choir "St. Cäcilia" conducted by Eril Arndt will be in charge of the musical arrangement. Everyone is also welcome to attend the Vespers for the first advent taking place at 5 pm in the house chapel.

In his invitation the General Superior writes: "Just as the Communio foundress Mother Marie Therese was totally convinced of a forgiving and unconditionally merciful God, also the modern constitutional state has developed away from the idea of atonement to the idea of resocialization and therapy. We are looking forward to an interesting talk and getting the chance to talk to the Minister."

"The Communio in Christo is particularly present in its works of charity, calling attention to the Council. A founder registers what is missing. He has envisaged an idea and has found the essence in the Gospel and intends to call attention to it. With all his life and heart he strives to realize what he has recognized and conveys it in activities.

The Communio in Christo sees its goal in the love of God. None of its members are holy. They know themselves too well to think that God does not need to heal anything more. The revelation of his loving kindness, however, has eventually led them to show the message of Jesus in a new light and to gather as a people of God. There is room for all denominations if the striving for both the love for God and the love for man is the only motivation.

Being on the march together as one people, united in love and joined in Christ – that is the order Communio in Christo."
